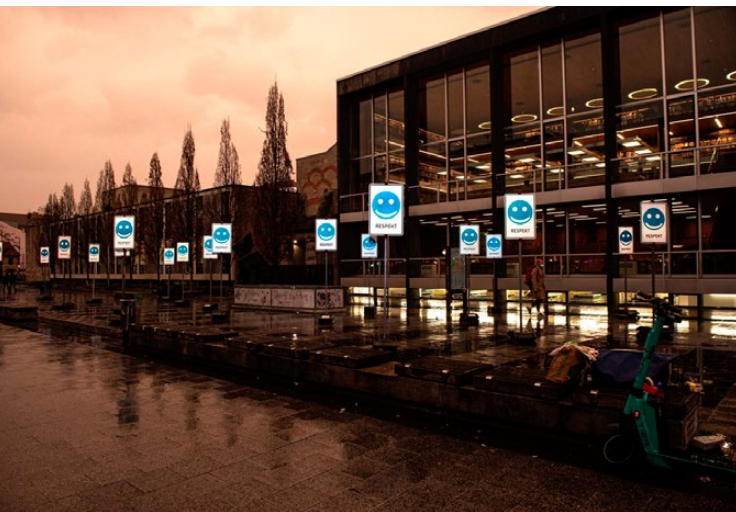




# Traffic Signs of Justice

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Johannes Volkmann – Das Papiertheater

A transformative 5-day workshop aimed at educators across Europe, focusing on creative teaching methods, cultural exchange, and fostering a deeper understanding of justice.

**Artistic Workshops:** Experience creative learning through methods like collage and theater.

**Led by Experts:** Organized by the Department of Teacher Training and the Office for Cultural Education by the district government of Arnsberg, and Johannes Volkmann of “Das Papiertheater.”

### Schedule and Activities:

**May 13th:** Start 09:00; Democracy building and cultural education, networking activities, initiatives and programmes for schools

**May 14th:** Introduction by Johannes Volkmann, presentation of the 8 “Traffic Signs of Justice”, and group work to develop ideas for school projects.

**May 15th:** Integration of 10 local students in workshops, with a focus on paper theater exploring “Opinion” and “Freedom”. Street performances and language pieces in the afternoon.

**May 16th:** Creation of an artistic installation at the town square, opening ceremony with speeches and paper theater scenes. Official project conclusion with European guests.

**May 17th:** Development of strategy for implementation and performance of an intervention within the own school and city and how to transfer the workshop learnings. Tips by our artist to find cultural education partners for the project. Reflection and evaluation of the workshop. End at 15:00.

### Workshop Goals:

**Embrace Cultural Diversity:** Understand and appreciate the values and cultures of other countries and societies.

**Collaborative Creativity:** Work on cross-border cultural projects with fellow educators from across Europe.

**Skill Enhancement:** Develop and expand abilities in planning and implementing cultural educational offerings.

**Democracy through Culture:** Utilize the potentials of cultural education to foster democratic competencies and attitudes.

**Artistic Democracy:** Explore democratic values and processes through artistic expressions.



**Empowerment in Action:** Engage in the democratic empowerment of students and civil society.

**Project Innovation:** Plan, implement, and evaluate democracy-enhancing projects using cultural education approaches in your school.

**Networking for Change:** Initiate and maintain networks with other actors in cultural and democratic education.

**EU Values in Focus:** Identify with the values and goals of the European Union and promote them in your professional fields.

**Championing SDGs:** Support the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within your institutions.

Educators and cultural multipliers from NRW and Europe, passionate about shaping contemporary educational spaces through creativity and political engagement. We recommend two teachers per institution in order to perform the installation in their home town.
